

Trade Sampler: CULINARY PROGRAM

School District No. 23 & Okanagan College

Participating students in the Culinary Arts and Pastry Arts Trades Sampler Program will explore and learn about some of the current in-demand careers in the Culinary and Pastry Arts industries while earning high school graduation credits. Students will explore Culinary Arts and Pastry Arts through a variety of practical hands-on learning opportunities along with a 10-week practicum with a local employer. Successful students will also earn a Career Education and Math credit towards high school graduation, on top of 3 grade-12 elective courses for successful completion of the program.

Dual Credit Opportunities

Successful students in the Trades Sampler programs can go on to apply to a SD No. 23 Dual Credit program for their Grade 12 school year for either Culinary Arts or Pastry Arts at Okanagan College (OC). With early planning of a student's grad plan, students can start a dual credit program at one of our post-secondary partners for Level 1 training as early as July of their grade 12 year.
